Up to two students will be selected from each Division and the School of Business**

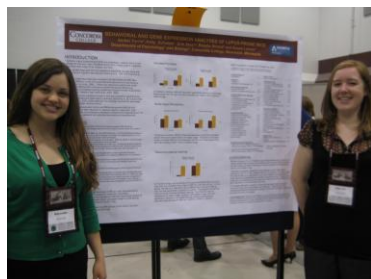
Concordia will provide funding for travel costs, hotel (shared rooms), and conference registration*. Students will be responsible for the cost of meals, checked bags, and other incidentals.

To apply for this opportunity please submit the following to Susan Larson (larson@cord.edu):

- **Personal statement** indicating how this experience will benefit your academic career (200-300 words)
- **An endorsement** (approximately 100-200 words) from your research supervisor or chair of the department in which the work was completed. This endorsement should indicate that this student is qualified to present this work and will be a good ambassador for Concordia. It can be submitted directly to the Division Chair.
- **Abstract of the work** (250-300 words): The abstract should state, in clear terms, the central research question and the purpose of the research, provide a brief description of the methodology, state conclusions, either final or anticipated, and be well organized.

Concordia Application Deadline: October 31

Candidates selected by Concordia will be notified by November 7 and they will be required to submit an abstract to the NCUR site by November 15



* Students who do not receive confirmation from the Director of Undergraduate Research that they were accepted for this travel opportunity will not receive college funds to travel to this meeting.
